

The First Bay Boaters

Bay Folks have been Rocking their Boats for generations. When we get onto the Chesapeake's waters today, we see tall sails, loud diesel engines, and gasoline outboards churning up the Bay. Boating is an expensive and intensive proposition today. There are rules, regulations, and training required to be a waterman today.

There was a time when all you needed was something that floated. It may have been an old tree, some grass mats, or rafts. Anyone near the water just had to find a way to float on it. Paddles, oars, and poles powered these primitive watercraft. Watersheds were the main avenue for traveling around the Bay. More fish, oysters, waterfowl, and trade were possible if you had a boat!

The main native peoples, and original boaters, were part of the Algonquin tribes. They shared a language and desire to utilize the Bay region. Historians believe over 40 tribes became watermen in some way or another.

The first boats were simple rafts constructed from felled trees that were lashed together. These rafts allowed the person to float into places where seafood was more abundant.

Next came Bull Boats. These simple round barrel-like boats were animal hides covering a wooden frame. There was no bow or stern. Starboard and port was just where you happened to be going. In shallow water, a push pole could be used. Paddles were also improvised.

Dugouts were the Chris Craft boat of the day. A big log was hollowed out using axes, fire, and oyster shell scrapers. It took several weeks to make a dugout, but these boats lasted for years. Usually, they were forged from oaks and poplar trees. Push poles and paddles were the power of these sleek boats. If the native people needed to take a cruise, several of these dugouts were lashed together into a big raft. A primitive sail could be used. Structures were built on top for shade and shelter.

Canoes were introduced when the Algonquins traded with tribes from the Great Lakes area. Using tree bark and skin-covered designs, the Bay Boaters would construct a wooden frame and bend the structure into a lightweight canoe. Smaller kayak-like canoes were perfect for checking fish traps and nets. These small boats also allowed the hunters to stealthily get close to big game and waterfowl.

Tribes were always arguing about something. Power, control, and jealousy often spawned attacks on each other's villages. Larger War canoes transported warriors into battle. The Susquehannocks were the most powerful warriors in the region. They raided along all the Chesapeake shores and into Delaware.

Boats meant transportation. Watersheds were the first interstates and roads. Traveling allowed for more trade, communication, and opportunity. Boats were not about fun and recreation. Tribes needed boats to travel and work from. These early floating craft were about survival for the early Hunters and Gatherers. I think of them as members of the Redskin Yacht Club.

Paddling along the Bay's waterways must have been even more amazing during early times. The native boaters must have enjoyed being on the water as much as modern boaters.

Even in early times, it was 5 o'clock somewhere!



What's That Floating Out There?

As a Captain, I am on the water in all conditions and have seen my fair share of floating tires, refrigerators, and tree trunks big enough to take out a 22' boat if not avoided. Branches, stumps, and garbage are

lifted from the shore by high tides and storms. The debris is then dispersed by wind, current and wave action throughout the Bay, causing devastating issues for the environment and marine life as well as potentially serious problems for recreational boaters.

Another large contributor to the Bay's marine debris is the Conowingo Dam. Debris originates upstream from the more than 27,500 miles of tributaries in the Susquehanna River watershed, flowing down through New York, Pennsylvania, and Maryland and is held back by the dam for months. When the flood spill gates are finally opened tons of sediment and rubbish are allowed to enter the lower Susquehanna and the Chesapeake Bay all at once. A few things you can do to stay safe on the water and avoid damaging your boat this Spring:

- Keep track of the dam openings by monitoring VHF radio channel 16 for announcements.
- Make sure you stay alert and slow down, especially at night, after storms and when the flood gates are opened.
- Maintain a lookout. Use your crew as an extra pair of eyes to help spot floating debris.
- Don't run through debris lines Go around slowly. Consider that what you can see above the water line is just the "tip" of what could damage your boat.

We challenge you to please stop and pick up floating debris whenever it is safe to do so. Post a picture on social media and tag us at @TowBoatUSab to help spread the word. By elevating the issue, we hope that boaters are more aware, the Bay is a bit cleaner and safer for all this season. As always, happy to help.

Fly, Bald Eagles, Fly

When I first started boating, fishing and otherwise enjoying the heck out of the Upper Chesapeake Bay, I was overwhelmed.

Not only were there rockfish (who names a fish after a rock?), blue crabs and all manner of sea creatures to learn about, but also an entirely new history.

Lighthouses, bridges, taverns, birds, trees and towns – some more significant than others, but all are fascinating in their way.

One of the many interesting places unique to the Upper Bay is the Conowingo Dam. An engineering marvel when constructed, the dam forever changed the surrounding area. During the winter, it is a very popular spot for photographers, who come from all over the world to capture eagles doing all manner of things.

I often wonder if the folks taking all those fantastic eagle pictures at the dam, know that a town lies beneath the mighty Susquehanna. Old Conowingo was swamped during the construction process and what little population remained was pushed up the hill.

It would give the shutterbugs something to think about while they wait for the next shot. For those of us who rely solely on our phones for picture-taking these days, seeing the line of avid birders with huge cameras seldom seen outside of a sports arena, is almost as interesting as the eagles. When dusk approaches and the eagles fly home with dinner, the line of photographers traces their paths with a synchronicity that is as majestic as the regal eagles.

The most popular time to visit the landing area at the dam is the dead of winter, but don't worry, there isn't a "bad" time to go.

And eagles aren't the only birds you'll see if you look. All manner of birds take advantage of the easy feeding provided by the dam. Well over 200 species have been reported on eBird.

Eagles, gulls, and vultures are plentiful, although the gull population has thinned over the last few years.

I expect that will change soon. I saw so many gulls on the Susquehanna Flats recently, that I thought I seeing a sandbar in the fog!

There are plenty of spots to view them, but most birders head to the Harford County side at Fisherman's Park. From there you can view Rowland Island and get some great photographs.

The first time I went I was mesmerized by the vultures. Perhaps that is because I live on Turkey Point. When I first moved out on the peninsula, I thought it was named after wild turkeys, but after a couple of decades, I'm fairly certain it was named after turkey vultures. I see these birds so often; I was perplexed by the large population of black vultures on the island. Yes, I'm fairly easily perplexed by nature.

On the Cecil County side, look for waterfowl in the channels and all manner of birds on the rocky shore. Ospreys, eagles, and gulls can be seen from the Octoraro River Trail at Conowingo Park.


Look for Peregrine Falcons, Great Blue Herons, as well as Black-crowned Night Herons. The heron rookery is more active as the weather warms.


Orioles, vireos, warblers, flycatchers, woodpeckers, kinglets, Brown Creepers, and Winter Wrens can be spotted at different times. I'm no expert, so if you're interested be sure and consult the various birding groups online and on social media.

Have a great time watching those bald eagles fly!





Tim and Karen Seppi have created a peaceful and serene retreat on the spot that brought them together. Tim was working to revitalize an old vineyard at the time, and Karen was tasked with assisting him with whatever he needed. She started asking questions and working beside him and there – somewhere between the grape vines their love bloomed. Tim handles the year-round process of pruning, spraying, hedging, and leafing.

Some notable events at the vineyard include paint nights, yoga by the water, and a jazz dinner. You can also rent private event space, although they are not equipped for weddings and parties for anyone under 21. The tasting room holds 30 guests, and the outdoor patio can hold 200 guests. All food and liquor must be purchased on-site and why would you want anything other than these exceptional wines? And yes, you can purchase bottles to take with you. By Kimberly Houck



My group ordered a nice charcuterie board and a veggie platter and got down to business. The wine flights are a great option, as we got to experience multiple wines before deciding on our favorite.

I tried the Sangiovese, which has won the Silver Governors' Cup, and was quite delightful. It had a somewhat spicy taste and after prompting I could taste the hints of licorice. I also tried the Nouveau and fell in love. The deep dark red/purple look, the smoothness, and the warm hug it gave me....ahhh... I think my old pal Merlot might be cast aside for a time. And while this was my absolute favorite, I did; however, try their Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. Both were fantastic but I am a Nouveau girl now.

My partner in crime tested the Seyval Blanc, which is a delightful French hybrid, and had notes of citrus and green apple. She also tried their Chardonnay and the Summer Breeze. The Summer Breeze also had those citrus notes along with some floral notes. She thought the Summer Breeze was delicious and paired well with our charcuterie board. And for the second time in his life, our beer snob enjoyed wine. He is hard to please when it comes to anything beyond beer and bourbon but he enjoyed the Summer Breeze, as well.



Let 'GO'

Through my years of being on the water, I have experienced many types of boats. I've been on wooden McKenzie drift boats in the flowing Potomac and sportfishing yachts in the Atlantic Ocean. These boats and those in between all have a specific purpose. No matter what the vessel is, they all provide the ability to get us out to and on the water. New to the upper Chesapeake is the personal-size, inflat-able GoBoat. It is turning heads and sparking the question, "What is that?!"

The GoBoat 2.0 is a 70-inch round inflatable boat that offers stability, accessibility, and a whole lot of fun. The boat can be packed neatly in a portable carry bag and assembled and inflated in minutes. The seat, which inflates separately, is adjustable with straps from reclining to upright positions. The manufacturer reports using a round platform because it is stable, untippable, and can take waves from any direction. At 70-inches, it provides a lot of usable space. Stocky guys like me need not worry. This model is rated for up to 300 pounds. The 2.0 is powered by a 35-pound thrust electric trolling motor with a top speed of 5 miles per hour. The trolling motor has 5 forward speeds and 3 reverse speeds. Truth be told, low speed in reverse is truly all you need in most situations. A 12-volt battery lasts up to 4 hours. The boat is made from a composite drop stitch material called Aircore. It is a very lightweight, yet tough material that adds rigidity to the inflated platform. The air tube is made from a dense layer of PVC that is extremely puncture-resistant. The deck features a bungee strap system to secure your gear.

I had the opportunity to give the GoBoat 2.0 Stealth a whirl in Dark Head Creek. Upper Bay Boating publisher, Jim High was aboard the Woody model. My upper 50-something-yearold arthritic knees always have me apprehensive when boarding small craft. Once on board, the inflatable showed its true rigidity and stability. The trolling motor pulled this stout-bodied writer along with ease. The steering takes a little getting used to as it is instantaneous, being piloted by the trolling motor throttle handle.

BOAT

The Stealth model comes with pad mounts, which allows you to add accessories like cupholders, oar mounts, and my favorite ... fishing rod holders. As for uses – WOW! I can see numerous fishing waters to access where even the shallowest draft boats can't reach. The GoBoat can give you hours of enjoyment, merely meandering around in your favorite creek or cove. Nature explorers can venture farther into the backwaters than ever. No slips available at the dockside restaurant or ship's store, no problem. The GoBoat can easily serve as a portable dinghy.

Your local GoBoat dealer is Captain Jim High. Along with the Woody and Stealth models, he will also have the Havana model available. GoBoat also offers a 2-person Double Freedom boat.
